Altar Guild a most important service in the House of God, that of preparing the holy things for the holy ones, caring for the sacred vessels and linens. Our congregation is blessed with many



What Can I Do? Glad you asked! As you know, the St. Paul's Preschool mission is currently in its twelfth year (thanks be to God) of sharing the love of Jesus with the children and their families --- what a wonderful mission! And our church family is blessed again with the *opportunity to interact with the preschool families*, some of whom may attend a church Service or two in the coming weeks. If you see someone new, welcome him or her, sit with him or her, and offer your assistance during the Service --- it may be their first time. Beyond that --- just as important, members are needed to attend the preschool events whenever possible --- to engage the parents and grandparents. Organist at St. Paul's—Since November 2002, the organist at St. Paul's has been Pastor Rutter. He is able to serve in this capacity by means of technology, whereby the 2002 Allen Digital Protégé Organ is



able to interface with a Palm-Pilot to record and play-back every key-stroke, piston-push, and expression-pedal movement. During the "recording phase", which usually occurs on the Saturday prior to the Sunday Service, the hymns and various parts of the Service are played on the organ (as any organist would play them), and saved into individual files onto a 2002 Hewlett Packard Palm-Pilot, which later, upon request, streams the data from the individual files back into the organ computer and *voila!* ... the organ sounds exactly as the Pastor had played it several hours earlier.

To make this "playback" happen during the Services, a member of the congregation operates the Palm Pilot at precisely the "right moment", with the result that it appears that there is a living organist on the bench. Many members have operated the Palm Pilot during the past 12 years, for which we are thankful and grateful --- there is a certain level of stress involved and a commitment to arrive 20 minutes early. Other members are welcome to add their names to the rotation --- there is a 5-minute training process, and first-timers are assisted by the experienced until they are comfortable "going solo." Please contact the church office.

A living organist on the bench is ideal, and for \$20,000 - \$30,000 per year we could probably hire a decent one. But the present "technology" system does work --- fairly reliably.

As the Palm Pilot ages (the product is no longer manufactured and well beyond its life-expectancy), it may eventually no longer function, and we may have to hire an actual organist. For the time being, we are able to make use of the Pastor's musical gifts as he serves the congregation.

#### One Dollar Per Member Per Week for Missions ---- "1-1-1"

At the June 2018 Convention of the English District, the district of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod to which our congregation belongs, an overture was adopted to encourage congregations of the English District to begin and join in a new program entitled, "1-1-1." This program basically means each member, including the youngest baptized member, brings an extra \$1.00 every week, and places it into a special "mission box." The collected monies will be sent to the English District to enable the District to support various missions and raise up, support, and send church workers into the harvest field. One congregation in Wisconsin adopted this program and raised \$5000 in one year for a designated mission. The English District is using the funds from this new "1-1-1" program of the congregations presently participating to begin a mission in Myerstown, Pennsylvania (Concordia Lutheran Mission), as well as to increase the help extended to our church partners in the Dominican Republic, a ministry the English District has supported for a number of years. Imagine if this new program was adopted by all 162 congregations of the English District --- we could fund more missionaries, more church work students could be recruited, more teachers could be commissioned overseas, --- the list could be endless. If, after seeing the English District use this new program, the congregations of the entire Synod participated --- even at only 50% of baptized membership, \$52,500,000 would be generated. Considering the annual budget of the Synod is \$69,400,000, this is quite remarkable. "There is power and strength in many giving a little." St. Paul's congregation will begin this program in February
